Dear First Family,

Paul pleaded with the believers in Rome to present themselves as a living sacrifice by the mercies of God (Romans 12:1). After discussing the meaning of a living sacrifice, we were able to see such an offering is only possible by the enabling power of God's infinite mercy. Not until we understand that just as we are unable to save ourselves, we also are powerless to empower ourselves. To become such a living sacrifice requires us to trust the Holy Spirit to indwell us moment by moment.

This point of constantly living submitted to God was driven home by Paul's reference to our spiritual worship. In the context of altars and sacrifices, worship becomes the dominant theme. For our worship to be true and spiritual, it must be maintained daily, it must be nurtured constantly, just like the altars and sacrificial fires of the Old Testament had to be daily attended to be continuously sustained.
